Jesus' Temptation: Overcoming All Mathew 04: 01-11

(Mk 1:12-13; Lk 4:1-13)

1. The temptation of Jesus

- a. Was led by the Spirit
- b. Was tempted by the devil
- 2. The first temptation: To prove His deity by using His power for personal reasons
 - a. The temptation
 - 1) To secure man's loyalty by His own power
 - 2) To trust Himself and His own ability instead of God
 - b. Jesus' answer: Quoted Script.
 - 1) Man needs more than bread
 - Man needs God and His Word to meet needs
- 3. The second temptation:
 To prove His deity by the spectacular
 - a. The temptation
 - 1) To test God: See if He will fulfill His promises of Him no matter what sin or foolish thing He did
 - 2) To attract attention by the spectacular and secure the people's following
 - b. Jesus' answer: Quoted Script.
 - 1) God is not to be tested
 - 2) God, not the spectacular, is to be trusted
- 4. The third temptation:
 To prove His deity by compromise
 - a. The temptation
 - 1) To achieve His purpose by another route
 - To switch loyalties or take a shortcut to secure the people's worship
 - b. Jesus' answer: Quoted Scripture
 - 1) Satan must be rejected
 - 2) God alone must be worshipped and served
- 5. The triumphant victory:
 Christ conquered the temptation

- 1 Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil.
- 2 After fasting forty days and forty nights, he was hungry.
- 3 The tempter came to him and said, "If you are the Son of God, tell these stones to become bread."
- 4 Jesus answered, "It is written:'Man does not live on bread alone,but on every word that comes from the mouth of God."
- 5 Then the devil took him to the holy city and had him stand on the highest point of the temple.
- "throw yourself down.

 For it is written:

 'He will command his angels concerning you,
 and they will lift you up in their hands,
 so that you will not strike your foot against a stone."
- 7 Jesus answered him,"It is also written:'Do not put the Lord your God to the test.'"

6 "If you are the Son of God," he said,

- 8 Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their splendour.
- 9 "All this I will give you," he said, "if you will bow down and worship me."
- 10 Jesus said to him, "Away from me, Satan! For it is written: 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve him only."
- 11 Then the devil left him, and angels came and attended him.
