2. Tradition can be hypocritical honour	6 He replied, "Isaiah was right when he prophesied about you hypocrites; as it is written: 'These people honour me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me.
3. Tradition can be empty, worthless worship	7 They worship me in vain; their teachings are but rules taught by men.'
4. Tradition can be man-made commands	8 You have let go of the commands of God and are holding on to the traditions of men."

a. They twisted God's commands
