Jesus Prayed for His Disciples

John 17:09-19

1. Jesus prayed for His disciples

- a. Because they had been entrusted to Him
- b. Because they belonged to both Jesus and *God*
- c. Because glory came to Jesus through them
- d. Because Jesus was leaving the world

2. Request 1:

That God would keep them and keep them together as one

- a. Because they were in the world
- b. Because He had kept them and had lost none

3. Request 2:

That they might have His joy in all its fullness

4. Request 3:

That God would keep them from the evil one, from Satan

- a. Because the world hated them
- b. Because they were needed in the world
- c. Because they were now of the same nature as Jesus

5. Request 4:

That God would sanctify them

- a. Because they were sent into the world
- b. Because sanctification (being set apart to God) is the way of salvation

9 I pray for them.I am not praying for the world,but for those you have given me,

for they are yours.

- 10 All I have is yours,and all you have is mine.And glory has come to me through them.
- 11 I will remain in the world no longer,
 but they are still in the world,
 and I am coming to you.
 Holy Father, protect them by the power of your name the name you gave me so that they may be one as we are one.
- 12 While I was with them, I protected them and kept them safe by that name you gave me.

 None has been lost except the one doomed to destruction so that Scripture would be fulfilled.
- 13 "I am coming to you now, but I say these things while I am still in the world, so that they may have the full measure of my joy within them.
- 14 I have given them your word and the world has hated them, for they are not of the world any more than I am of the world.
- 15 My prayer is not that you take them out of the world but that you protect them from the evil one.
- 16 They are not of the world, even as I am not of it.
- 17 Sanctify them by the truth; your word is truth.
- 18 As you sent me into the world, I have sent them into the world.
- 19 For them I sanctify myself, that they too may be truly sanctified.
