## 1. The availability of power

- a. Jesus joined the crowd after the transfiguration
- b. Jesus was approached by a desperate man

## 2. The tragedy of no power

- a. A desperate need unmet: Had often gone unmet
- b. A frantic disappointment
- c. An embarrassing situation: Could not heal him

## 3. The rebuke of no power

- a. His presence will not always be available
- b. His patience was limited
- c. His power broke the power of Satan
- **4.** The clear reason for no power: Unbelief
- 5. The great power of faith promised

14 When they came to the crowd, a man approached Jesus and knelt before him.

- 15 "Lord, have mercy on my son," he said.

  "He has seizures and is suffering greatly.

  He often falls into the fire or into the water.
- 16 I brought him to your disciples, but they could not heal him."

Bring the boy here to me."

- 17 "O unbelieving and perverse generation,"Jesus replied,"how long shall I stay with you?How long shall I put up with you?
- 18 Jesus rebuked the demon, and it came out of the boy, and he was healed from that moment.
- 19 Then the disciples came to Jesus in private and asked, "Why couldn't we drive it out?"
- 20 He replied, "Because you have so little faith.

  I tell you the truth,
  if you have faith as small as a mustard seed,
  you can say to this mountain,
  'Move from here to there' and it will move.
  Nothing will be impossible for you."
