- 3 The unbelievable appearance of a real angel to shepherds
 - a. His appearance:Shone in the glory of the Lord
 - b. His message:Reassured good news
 - A proclamation:
 The Messiah's birth
 - 2) A charge: Visit the child

- 1 In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world.
- 2 (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.)
- 3 And everyone went to his own town to register.
- 4 So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David.
- 5 He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child.
- 6 While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born,
- 7 And she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.
- 8 And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night.
- 9 An angel of the Lord *appeared* to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified.
- 10 But the angel said to them,
 "Do not be afraid.

 I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people.
- 11 Today in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord.
- 12 This will be a sign to you:
 You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."
