- 1. What value is there in being a Jew, a religionist
 - in being circumcised or baptized
 - if all are guilty before God? Rom. 1-3
 - a. He is privileged
 - b. He is entrusted with and responsible for God's Word
- 2. Does unbelief void God's promises make God a liar?
 - a. Not at all
 - b. God's Word stands even if every man is a liar
 - c. God will prove His Word
 - d. God will overcome those who judge Him and His Word
- 3. Is God unjust if He punishes the unrighteous?
 - a. The absurd claim:
 Sin serves a good purpose
 if it gives God a chance to forgive,
 to show mercy
 - Fact: God is moral;
 He must judge the world
 - 2) The contradiction of such an argument
 - b. The condemnation of persons who argue such is deserved

- 1 What advantage, then, is there in being a Jew, or what value is there in circumcision?
- 2 Much in every way!First of all,they have been entrusted with the very words of God.
- 3 What if some did not have faith? Will their lack of faith nullify God's faithfulness?
- 4 Not at all!Let God be true,and every man a liar.As it is written:"So that you may be proved right when you speak and prevail when you judge."
- 5 But if our unrighteousness brings out God's righteousness more clearly, what shall we say?That God is unjust in bringing his wrath on us? (I am using a human argument.)
- 6 Certainly not!
 If that were so,
 how could God judge the world?
- 7 Someone might argue, "If my falsehood enhances God's truthfulness and so increases his glory, why am I still condemned as a sinner?"
- 8 Why not say as we are being slanderously reported
 as saying and as some claim that we say "Let us do evil that good may result"?
 Their condemnation is deserved.
