The Final Farewell of Paul to the World

2 Timothy 04:09–22

1. *A personal message — needing help*

- a. There are special times
when believers need help
 - 1) When a loved one
has forsaken God
 - 2) When left alone
because loved ones have gone
to their own ministry
 - 3) When help is needed
in the ministry
 - 4) When a fellow labourer
has to be sent forth
to his own ministry
 - 5) When personal items are needed
and are out of reach

9 Do your best to come to me quickly,

10 For Demas,
because he loved this world,
has deserted me and has gone to Thessalonica.
Crescens has gone to Galatia,
and Titus to Dalmatia.

11 Only Luke is with me.
Get Mark and bring him with you,
because he is helpful to me in my ministry.

12 I sent Tychicus to Ephesus.

13 When you come,
bring the cloak that I left with Carpus at Troas,
and my scrolls, especially the parchments.
