The Lord's First Charge: They were Rebellious Isaiah 01:01–10

- God's prophet Isaiah: He was a man given a very special vision by God
 - a. Concerned Judah and Jerusalem
 - b. Touched the reigns of four kings
- 2. God's first charge: They were rebellious children
 - a. The picture of a court trial: Called on heaven and earth to witness the charges
 - b. The charge: Rebellion
 - They had less knowledge and understanding than an ox or donkey
 - 2) They had become a sinful people, loaded down with guilt: Were evil and corrupt children
 - They had forsaken the LORD despised the Holy One, turned their backs on Him
 - c. The folly of rebellion: Continued chastisement
 - They were like victims, attacked and injured in both head and heart
 - With the whole body beaten, bruised and cut
 - With wounds left untreated and allowed to fester and rot
 - 2) They were to witness their country ravaged
 - Their cities burned
 - Their farms plundered and destroyoud

- 1 The vision concerning Judah and Jerusalem that Isaiah the son of Amoz saw during the reigns of Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah, kings of Judah.
- Hear me, you heavens!
 Listen, earth!
 For the LORD hath spoken:
 "I reared children and brought up, but they have rebelled against me.
- 3 The ox knows its master, the donkey its owner's manger, *but* Israel does not know, my people do not understand."
- Woe to the sinful nation,
 a people whose guild is great,
 a brood of evildoers,
 children given to corruption!
 They have forsaken the LORD,
 they have spurned the Holy One of Israel
 and turned their backs on him.
- 5 Why should you be beaten anymore? Why do you persist in rebellion? Your whole head is injured, your whole heart afflicted.
- 6 From the sole of your foot to the top of your head there is no soundness only wounds and welts and open sores, not cleansed or bandaged or soothed with olive oil.
- 7 Your country is desolate, your cities burned with fire, your fields are being stripped by foreigners right before you, laid waste as when overthrown by strangers.

- Their capital Jerusalem, the Daughter of Zion, besieged and destroyoud: Would be nothing more than a shattered hut
- 3) They were to be judged like Sodom and Gomorrah, utterly decimated: BUT God would leave a remnant, a few survivors
- d. The call to hear God's Word: Like Sodom and Gomorrah, they had rejected God's Word

- 8 Daughter of Zion is left
 like a shelter in a vineyard,
 like a hut in a cucumbers field,
 like a city under siege.
- 9 Unless the LORD Almighty had left us some survivors, we would have become like Sodom, we would have been like Gomorrah.
- 10 Hear the word of the LORD, you rulers of Sodom; listen to the instruction of our God, you people of Gomorrah!
