He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him, 1) He grew up in God's care nothing in his appearance but on dry ground: Poverty that we should desire him. 2) He had nothing attractive or majestic about His appearance

- c. His coming as a man of sorrows who had to suffer for the human race was rejected
  - He was despised and scorned by people
  - 2) He was turned away from, not esteemed
- 3 He is despised and rejected by mankind, a man of suffering, and familiar with pain.Like one from whom people hide their faces he was despised, and we held him in low esteem.

He willingly and silently suffered harsh treatment: Just like a lamb led to the slaughter</li> </ul>	7	He was oppressed and afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; he was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth.

He willingly suffered an illegal arrest, trial and execution</li> <li>1) He was cut off — put to death — for the transgression of God's people</li> <li>2) He was stricken for the sins of God's people</li> <li>c. He willingly suffered a burial</li> </ul>	8	By oppression and judgment he was taken away. Yet who of his generation protested? For he was cut off from the land of the living; for the transgression of my people he was punished. He was assigned a grave with the wicked,
with the wicked, even though He was the sinless Son of God		and with the rich in his death, though he had done no violence, nor was any deceit in his mouth.
