## God's Power to Protect and Provide for Israel (His People) Isaiah 41:08–20

- 1. God's assurance:
  They were His chosen servants
  - a. He would gather them from the ends of the earth:Set them free from Babylonian captivity. 43:1-7
  - b. He would not reject them
- 2. God's promise to protect His people
  - a. They were not to fear:He would be with them,help them and uphold them
  - God would shame and confuse all who opposed them
  - God would totally eliminate all the enemies of His people
  - b. They were not to fear, because He would hold their right hands and help them
  - c. They were not to fear,because He was theirRedeemer:He would deliver themfrom captivity

- 8 "But you, Israel, my servant, Jacob, whom I have chosen, you decendants of Abraham my friend,
- 9 I took you from the ends of the earth, from its farthest corners I called you.I said, 'You are my servant';I have chosen you, and hve not rejected you.
- 10 So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.
- 11 All who rage against you will surely be ashamed and disgraced; those who oppose you will be as nothing and perish.
- 12 Though you search for your enemies, you will not find them.

  Those who wage war against you will be as nothing at all.
- 13 For I am the LORD, your God, who takes hold of your right hand and says to you,
  Do not fear;
  I will help you.
- 14 Do not be afraid, you worm Jacob, little Israel, do not fear, for I myself will help you," declares the LORD, your Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel.

- God would empower them to defeat their enemies
- God would give His people a reason to rejoice and to glory in Him
- 3. God's promise to provide for His people

As they suffered in exile or returned from captivity

- a. The people would be poor and needy, parched with thirst
- b. The LORD would hear their cry and prayer
- He would provide water
- He would provide a fruitful land: Make desert into productive land
- c. The LORD's purpose:
  To demonstrate His power,
  showing that He alone
  could free His people
  and meet their needs, 14, 16

- 15 "See, I will make you into a threshing sledge, new and sharp, with many teeth.

  You will thresh the mountains and crush them, and reduce the hills to chaff.
- 16 You will winnow them, the wind will pick them up, and a gale will blow them away. But you will rejoice in the LORD and glory in the Holy One of Israel.
- 17 "The poor and needy search for water, but there is none; their tongues are parched with thirst.

  But I the Lord will answer them;
  I, the God of Israel, will not forsake them."
- 18 I will make rivers flow on barren hights, and springs within the valleys.

  I will turn the desert into pools of water, and the parched ground into springs.
- 19 1 will put in the desert the cedar and the acacia, the myrtle and the olive. I will set junipers in the wasteland, the fir and the cypress together,
- 20 so that people may see and know, may consider and understand, that the hand of the LORD has done this, that the Holy One of Israel has created it.
