## The Great Proof of Salvation 2 Peter 01:16–21

- 1 The great truth: Salvation is not a fable; it is the power and coming of Christ
- 2 The first proof of salvation: The great eyewitness account of Christ's majesty and transfiguration
  - a. The honour and glory of God
  - b. The voice from heaven
  - c. The testimony: "We heard"
- 3. The second proof of salvation:
  Scripture —
  the more certain account
  of prophecy or Scripture
  - a. Scripture is more sure than an eyewitness account
  - b. Scripture is to be heeded
  - c. Scripture is not of one's own interpretation
    - 1) Because it is not given by man's will
    - 2) Because it is given by the Spirit

- 16 We did not follow cleverly invented stories when we told you about the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty.
- 17 For he received honour and glory from God the Father when the voice came to him from the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased."
- 18 We ourselves heard this voice that came from heaven when we were with him on the sacred mountain.
- 19 And we have the word of the prophets made more certain, and you will do well to pay attention to it, as to a light shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts.
- 20 Above all, you must understand that no prophecy of Scripture came about by the prophet's own interpretation.
- 21 For prophecy never had its origin in the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.
