| <p>1 <i>A sacrificial faith:</i>
<i>He chose God and God's people rather than this world and its pleasures</i></p> | <p>24 By faith Moses, when he had grown up, refused to be known as the son of Pharaoh's daughter.</p> <p>25 He chose to be mistreated along with the people of God rather than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a short time.</p> |
| <p>2 <i>An expectant faith:</i>
<i>He looked to the reward</i>
(v. 26, 27, 28)</p> | <p>26 He regarded disgrace for the sake of Christ as of greater value than the treasures of Egypt, because he was looking ahead to his reward.</p> |
| <p>3 <i>An enduring faith:</i>
<i>He courageously looked to God instead of looking to men</i></p> | <p>27 By faith he left Egypt, not fearing the king's anger; he persevered because he saw him who is invisible.</p> |
| <p>4 <i>A saving faith:</i>
<i>He believed God's message of salvation</i></p> | <p>28 By faith he kept the Passover and the sprinkling of blood, so that the destroyer of the firstborn would not touch the firstborn of Israel.</p> |
