

# Christ Secures Supremacy for Man

## Hebrews 02:05–13

### 1 *God's plan for the world to come*

- a. It does not belong to angels
- b. It belongs to man

### 2 *God's plan for man*

- a. To create man lower than the angels for a short time
- b. To crown man with glory and honour and authority
- c. Man is presently seen in a fallen state

### 3 *God's plan for Christ*

- a. To make Christ a little lower than the angels; to suffer and taste death for everyone
- b. To be exalted, crowned with honour and glory
- c. To show the very nature of God
  - 1) By bringing many sons to glory
  - 2) By making the author of their salvation perfect through suffering

5 It is not to angels that he has subjected the world to come, about which we are speaking.

6 But there is a place where someone has testified: “What is man that you are mindful of him, the son of man that you care for him?

7 You made him a little lower than the angels; you crowned him with glory and honour

8 And put everything under his feet.” In putting everything under him, God left nothing that is not subject to him. Yet at present we do not see everything subject to him.

9 But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels, now crowned with glory and honour because he suffered death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone.

10 In bringing many sons to glory, it was fitting that God, for whom and through whom everything exists, should make the author of their salvation perfect through suffering.

d. To share equally with the holy,  
that is, believers

1) The same Father

2) The same position:  
Brotherhood

3) The same worship

4) The same way of trust

11 Both the one who makes men holy  
and those who are made holy  
are of the same family.  
So Jesus is not ashamed  
to call them brothers.

12 He says,  
“I will declare your name to my brothers;  
in the presence of the congregation  
I will sing your praises.”

13 And again,  
“I will put my trust in him.”  
And again he says,  
“Here am I,  
and the children God has given me.”

# Christ Secures The Triumphant Victory for Man

## Hebrews 02: 14–18

### 1. *Christ became*

#### *man's great Deliverer*

- a. By becoming a man
- b. By dying for us
- c. By destroying the devil's power over sin and death
- d. By delivering us from the fear of death
- e. By freeing us from the showing of the flesh (sinful nature)

### 2. *Christ became*

#### *man's great High Priest*

- a. To become sympathetic to men
- b. To become faithful to God
- c. To make atonement
- d. To help those who are tried and tempted

14 Since the children have flesh and blood, he too shared in their humanity so that by his death he might destroy him who holds the power of death — that is, the devil —

15 And free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death.

16 For surely it is not angels he helps, but Abraham's descendants.

17 For this reason he had to be made like his brothers in every way, in order that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in service to God, and that he might make atonement for the sins of the people.

18 Because he himself suffered when he was tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted.
