

The Events of the Transfiguration: A Glimpse into Glory

Luke 09:28–36

(Mt. 17:1-13; Mk. 9:2-13)

1 Jesus took three disciples up onto a mountain 2 Event 1: Jesus was praying 3 Event 2: The countenance and clothing of Jesus were changed — as bright as lightning 4 Event 3: Two men appeared and talked with Jesus a. Moses, the lawgiver; Elijah, the great prophet b. They discussed His death 5 Event 4: Three disciples witnessed the event a. Peter, James and John b. They desired to retain the experience 6 Event 5: A cloud overshadowed them 7 Event 6: A voice spoke to them 8 Event 7: A stunned silence fell upon them	28 About eight days after Jesus said this, he took Peter, John and James with him and went up onto a mountain to pray. 29 As he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became as bright as a flash of lightning. 30 Two men, Moses and Elijah, 31 Appeared in glorious splendour, talking with Jesus. They spoke about his departure, which he was about to bring to fulfilment at Jerusalem. 32 Peter and his companions were very sleepy, but when they became fully awake, they saw his glory and the two men standing with him. 33 As the men were leaving Jesus, Peter said to him, “Master, it is good for us to be here. Let us put up three shelters — one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.” (He did not know what he was saying.) 34 While he was speaking, a cloud appeared and enveloped them, and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. 35 A voice came from the cloud, saying, “This is my Son, whom I have chosen; listen to him.” 36 When the voice had spoken, they found that Jesus was alone. The disciples kept this to themselves, and told no one at that time what they had seen.
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
