<p>1 <i>The need for deliverance:</i> <i>Man is sinful</i></p> <p>a. He practices sin</p> <p>b. He breaks the law</p>	<p>4 Everyone who sins breaks the law; in fact, sin is lawlessness.</p>
<p>2 <i>The provision for deliverance:</i> <i>Christ took away our sins</i></p>	<p>5 But you know that he appeared so that he might take away our sins. And in him is no sin.</p>
<p>3 <i>The proof of deliverance</i></p> <p>a. If we abide, live in Christ, we do not sin</p> <p>b. If we sin, we do not know Christ</p> <p>c. We can be deceived about the matter of sin and righteousness</p>	<p>6 No one who lives in him keeps on sinning. No one who continues to sin has either seen him or known him.</p>
<p>4 <i>The great conquest of Christ in deliverance</i></p> <p>a. The person who sins is of the devil</p> <p>b. The Son of God came to earth to destroy the devil's work</p>	<p>7 Dear children, do not let anyone lead you astray. He who does what is right is righteous, just as he is righteous.</p>
<p>5 <i>The result of deliverance:</i> <i>Being freed from living in sin</i></p>	<p>8 He who does what is sinful is of the devil, because the devil has been sinning from the beginning. The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the devil's work.</p> <p>9 No one who is born of God will continue to sin, because God's seed remains in him; he cannot go on sinning, because he has been born of God.</p>
