Acts 20:13-27

- 1 Paul's passion His face set for Jerusalem
 - a. His desire to be alone
 - b. His extreme hurry
 - 1) Was taken aboard the ship quickly
 - 2) Moved from place to place, wasting no time
 - 3) Felt so rushed he had even decided to bypass Ephesus
 - c. Was delayed, so he sent for the Ephesian elders
 - d. Shared his testimony
- 2 A constant, unswerving service
 - a. In great humility
 - b. In tears
 - c. In servere trials

- 13 We went on ahead to the ship and sailed for Assos, where we were going to take Paul aboard. He had made this arrangement because he was going there on foot.
- 14 When he met us at Assos, we took him aboard and went on to Mitylene.
- 15 The next day
 we set sail from there
 and arrived off Kios.The day after that we crossed over to Samos,
 and on the following day arrived at Miletus.
- 16 Paul had decided to sail past Ephesus to avoid spending time in the province of Asia, for he was in a hurry to reach Jerusalem, if possible, by the day of Pentecost.
- 17 From Miletus,
 Paul sent to Ephesus
 for the elders of the church.
- 18 When they arrived, he said to them: "You know how I lived the whole time I was with you, from the first day I came into the province of Asia.
- 19 I served the Lord
 with great humility
 and with tears,
 although I was severely tested
 by the plots of the Jews.

3 A sense of urgency in evangelism and teaching

- a. Taught the whole gospel
- b. Taught publicly and privately
- c. Taught powerfully, as a man under oath
- d. Taught Jews and Greeks
- e. Taught repentance and faith

4 A nagging compulsion: To reach the lost

5 A willingness to suffer

6 A total abandonment to Christ

- a. To complete his race
- b. To complete his tasks and ministry

7 A testimony of foreseeing his ministry in the future

8 A clear and pure heart

- a. He was innocent of the blood of all men
- b. Reason:He had proclaimedthe whole will of God

- 20 You know that I have not hesitated to preach anything that would be helpful to you but have taught you publicly and from house to house.
- 21 I have declared to both Jews and Greeks that they must turn to God in repentance and have faith in our Lord Jesus.
- 22 "And now, compelled by the Spirit, I am going to Jerusalem, not knowing what will happen to me there.
- 23 I only know that in every city the Holy Spirit warns me that prison and hardships are facing me.
- 24 However,
 I consider my life worth nothing to me,
 if only I may finish the race
 and complete the task
 the Lord Jesus has given me —
 the task of testifying
 to the gospel of God's grace.
- 25 "Now I know that none of you among whom I have gone about preaching the kingdom will ever see me again.
- 26 Therefore,
 I declare to you today
 that I am innocent of the blood of all men.
- 27 For I have not hesitated to proclaim to you the whole will of God.
