| <p><b>1</b> <i>Christ is the supreme example</i></p> <p><b>2</b> <i>Christ is of the very nature of God</i></p> <p><b>3</b> <i>Christ emptied Himself and became a man</i></p> <p><b>4</b> <i>Christ humbled Himself to the point of utter humiliation – to the very point of death</i></p> <p><b>5</b> <i>Christ was rewarded – highly exalted by God</i></p> <p>a. Given supreme worship as Lord</p> | <p><b>5</b> Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus:</p> <p><b>6</b> Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped,</p> <p><b>7</b> But made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness.</p> <p><b>8</b> And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death – even death on a cross!</p> <p><b>9</b> Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name,</p> <p><b>10</b> That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth,</p> <p><b>11</b> And every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.</p> |
