 a. His faith was in what God had said: The promise of a seed or offspring, a son 	
 He was not weak in faith despite thinking about his own inability 	 19 Without weakening in his faith, he faced the fact that his body was as good as dead – since he was about a hundred years old – and that Sarah's womb was also dead.
 2) He was strong in faith – not wavering, but giving glory to God 	20 Yet he did not waver through unbelief regarding the promise of God, but was strengthened in his faith and gave glory to God,
