	c. The reason for observing the Lord's Supper	26 For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.
4	 The severe consequences of partaking unworthily of the Lord's Supper a. A person becomes guilty of (profanes) the Lord's death 	27 Therefore, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord.
	b. A person condemns himself if he does not examine his heart for unconfessed sin	28 A man ought to examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup.
	c. A person is disciplined, chastened by the Lord	29 For anyone who eats and drinks without recognizing the body of the Lord eats and drinks judgment on himself.
		30 That is why many among you are weak and sick, and a number of you have fallen asleep.
5	The right approach to the Lord's Supper	31 But if we judged ourselves, we would not come under judgment.
	a. Judge – examine self	
	b. Accept the disciplining of the Lord	32 When we are judged by the Lord, we are being disciplined so that we will not be condemned with the world.
	c. Serve one another	33 So then, my brothers, when you come together to eat, wait for each other.
	d. Do not bring judgment upon yourselves	34 If anyone is hungry, he should eat at home, so that when you meet together it may not result in judgment. And when I come I will give further directions.
