## The Believer is to Walk by Using His Gifts Ephesians 04:07–16

- 1 Every believer is gifted
- 2 Every believer's gift has cost the greatest possible price
  - a. The picture
  - b. The great cost:The death of Christ and His descending into the lower parts of the earth
  - c. The great value: That Christ might fill the whole universe with His presence
- 3 Every believer's gift is Christ-centred
- 4 Every believer's gift has a threefold purpose
  - a. An immediate purpose: To equip others
  - b. An eternal purpose: To become a mature man like Christ
  - c. A personal purpose
    - 1) To no longer be children — immature

- 7 But to each one of us grace has been given as Christ apportioned it.
- 8 This is why it says:"When he ascended on high, he led captives in his train and gave gifts to men."
- 9 (What does "he ascended" mean except that he also descended to the lower, earthly regions?
- 10 He who descended is the very one who ascended higher than all the heavens, in order to fill the whole universe.)
- 11 It was he who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers,
- 12 To prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up
- 13 Until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.
- 14 Then we will no longer be infants, tossed back and forth by the waves, and blown here and there by every wind of teaching and by the cunning and craftiness of men in their deceitful scheming.

2) To grow up in all things — mature	15 Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will in all things grow up into him who is the Head, that is, Christ.
3) To do his part in building up the church	<ul><li>16 From him the whole body,</li><li>joined and held together</li><li>by every supporting ligament,</li><li>grows and builds itself up in love,</li><li>as each part does its work.</li></ul>
