When young: you will stretch out your hands, Peter walked and did and someone else will dress you as he willed and lead you where you do not want to go." b. When old: Another would lead Peter where he would not choose 19 Jesus said this 2. Total commitment demands the cross – death to self: to indicate the kind of death "Follow me" by which Peter would glorify God. Then he said to him, "Follow me!" 3. Total commitment demands 20 Peter turned and saw that the disciple whom Jesus loved undivided attention to one's own task was following them. (This was the one who had leaned back against Jesus at the supper and had said, "Lord, who is going to betray you?") a. Peter questioned John's task 21 When Peter saw him, he asked, "Lord, what about him?" b. Jesus rebuked Peter 22 Jesus answered, "If I want him to remain alive until I return, c. Jesus again challenged Peter what is that to you? to follow Him You must follow me." d. John corrected the rumour 23 Because of this, that started later the rumour spread among the brothers because of this event that this disciple would not die. But Jesus did not say that he would not die: he only said. "If I want him to remain alive until I return, what is that to you?"
