Heard in their “own native language”</p> | <p>1 When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place.</p> <p>2 Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting.</p> <p>3 They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them.</p> <p>4 All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.</p> <p>5 Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven.</p> <p>6 When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard them speaking in his own language.</p> <p>7 Utterly amazed, they asked: “Are not all these men who are speaking Galileans?”</p> <p>8 Then how is it that each of us hears them in his own native language?</p> |

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The First Sermon (Part I): The Gospel Message

Acts 02: 14–24

1 *Infilled believers*

a. An explanation required

14 Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd: “Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say.

b. Not under the influence of man-made, induced excitement

15 These men are not drunk, as you suppose. It’s only nine in the morning!

c. Experiencing the fulfilment of Scripture

16 No, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel:

2 *These are the last days, the days of God’s last work on earth*

a. The days of the great outpouring of God’s Spirit

17 ‘In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams.

b. The days of terrible judgment at the end — the Day of the Lord

18 Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy.

c. The days of great salvation

19 I will show wonders in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood and fire and billows of smoke.

20 The sun will be turned to darkness and the moon to blood before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord.

21 And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.’
