## The Formal Decree of the Council: The Great Decree on Salvation

Acts 15:23-35

- 1 There was the attitude that brought about the decree: Humility
- 23 With them they sent the following letter:
  The apostles and elders,
  your brothers,
  To the Gentile believers in Antioch,
  Syria and Cilicia:
  Greetings.
- 2 There was the declaration of the decree:
  Ritual and law are not necessary to salvation;
  the disputers were rebuked
- 24 We have heard that some went out from us without our authorization and disturbed you, troubling your minds by what they said.
- 3 There were the men chosen to proclaim the truth
- 25 So we all agreed to choose some men and send them to you with our dear friends Barnabas and Paul —
- a. Men loved, proven and experienced:Paul and Barnabas
- 26 Men who have risked their lives for the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- b. Men chosen as worthy supporters:Judas and Silas
- 27 Therefore we are sending Judas and Silas to confirm by word of mouth what we are writing.
- 4 There were the few rules that were necessary
- 28 It seemed good to the Holy Spirit and to us not to burden you with anything beyond the following requirements:
- 29 You are to abstain from food sacrificed to idols, from blood, from the meat of strangled animals and from sexual immorality.
  You will do well to avoid these things.
  Farewell.
- 5 There were the glorious results
- 30 The men were sent off and went down to Antioch, where they gathered the church together and delivered the letter.

- a. Brought about great gladness
- b. Brought about great encouragement
- c. Brought about the discovery of a great missionary— Silas

d. Brought about a great teaching and preaching ministry within the church

- 31 The people read it and were glad for its encouraging message.
- 32 Judas and Silas, who themselves were prophets, said much to encourage and strengthen the brothers.
- 33 After spending some time there, they were sent off by the brothers with the blessing of peace to return to those who had sent them.

- 35 But Paul and Barnabas remained in Antioch, where they and many others taught and preached the word of the Lord.
