The Reasons Some People Are Offended by Christ, the Bread of Life

John 06:59-71

- 1. The disturbing message of Jesus to the synagogue crowd
 - a. Many disciples were present
 - b. The disciples had difficulty accepting His message
- 2. The idea of eating Jesus' flesh and drinking His blood, vv. 51-56
- 3. The ascension and exaltation of Christ
- 4. The teaching that the Spirit quickens or gives life and that the flesh counts for nothing
 - a. Some did not believe
 - b. Some plotted to betray Him
- 5. The fact that God saves man, that man does not save himself
- 6. The conclusion:
 There were three responses
 - a. The disciples who turned back

- 59 He said this while teaching in the synagogue in Capernaum.
- 60 On hearing it, many of his disciples said, "This is a hard teaching. Who can accept it?"
- 61 Aware that his disciples were grumbling about this, Jesus said to them, "Does this offend you?
- 62 What if you see the Son of Man ascend to where he was before!
- 63 The Spirit gives life; the flesh counts for nothing. The words I have spoken to you are spirit and they are life.
- 64 Yet there are some of you who do not believe."

 For Jesus had known from the beginning which of them did not believe and who would betray him.
- 65 He went on to say,

 "This is why I told you
 that no one can come to me
 unless the Father has enabled him."
- 66 From this time many of his disciples turned back and no longer followed him.
- 67 "You do not want to leave too, do you?"

 Jesus asked the Twelve.

- b. The disciple who believed Jesus was the Christ
- 68 Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life.
- 69 We believe and know that you are the Holy One of God."
- c. The disciple who betrayed Christ
- 70 Then Jesus replied,
 "Have I not chosen you, the Twelve?
 Yet one of you is a devil!"
- 71 (He meant Judas, the son of Simon Iscariot, who, though one of the Twelve, was later to betray him.)
