1. Illustration 1: Jesus' purpose

- a. Came not to bring peace
- b. Came to bring a sword

2. Illustration 2: A person's family

- a. The fact:Christ sets the believer against his family
- b. The demand:Must love Christ supremely
- c. The reward:
 Counted worthy vs. unworthy

3. Illustration 3: The cross

- a. Demand: Die to self
- b. Reward:Counted worthy vs.unworthy of Christ

4. Illustration 4: A person's life

- a. Demand: Give up life
- b. The reward: Lose life vs. find life

5. Illustration 5: A person's ministry

a. The demand:Welcome a believer and minister to him

- 34 "Do not suppose that I have come to bring peace to the earth. I did not come to bring peace, but a sword.
- 35 For I have come to turn
 'a man against his father,
 a daughter against her mother,
 a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law —
- 36 A man's enemies will be the members of his own household.'
- 37 Anyone who loves his father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; anyone who loves his son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me;
- 38 And anyone who does not take his cross and follow me is not worthy of me.

- 39 Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.
- 40 He who receives you receives me, and he who receives me receives the one who sent me.

- b. Reward:Will be great
- 1) Will receive the presence of Christ and of God, v. 40
- 2) Will receive an equal reward, the same reward as the person to whom you minister
- 3) The strong assertion:
 The smallest ministry
 or service will not lose
 its reward
- 41 Anyone who receives a prophet because he is a prophet will receive a prophet's reward, and anyone who receives a righteous man because he is a righteous man will receive a righteous man's reward.
- 42 And if anyone gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones because he is my disciple,
 I tell you the truth,
 he will certainly not lose his reward."
