1 We were far off and separated from God

- a. We were barricaded from God: Were Gentiles and uncircumcised
- b. We were separate from Christ
- c. We were excluded from God's people (Israel)
- d. We were excluded from God's covenant and promises
- e. We were without hope and without God
- 2 Christ brings us near to God

3 Christ brings us peace

- a. He made all men as one
- b. He broke down all barriers
- c. He wiped out all rules
- d. He creates a "new man"

4 Christ brings us reconciliation

a. By the cross

- 11 Therefore,
 remember that formerly you
 who are Gentiles by birth
 and called "uncircumcised"
 by those who call themselves "the circumcision"
 (that done in the body by the hands of men) —
- 12 Remember that at that time you were separate from Christ, excluded from citizenship in Israel and foreigners to the covenants of the promise, without hope and without God in the world.
- 13 But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far away have been brought near through the blood of Christ.
- 14 For he himself is our peace, who has made the two one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility,
- 15 By abolishing in his flesh the law with its commandments and regulations. His purpose was to create in himself one new man out of the two, thus making peace.
- 16 And in this one bodyto reconcile both of them to Godthrough the cross,by which he put to death their hostility.

b. By the preaching of peace
17 He came and preached peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near.
5 Christ brings us access to God
18 For through him we both have access to the Father by one Spirit.
