The Relationship of Jesus to the People of the World John 15:01–08

- 1. Jesus, the Vine; God, the Gardener; man, the branch
- 2. Unfruitful branches: Are taken away
- 3. Fruitful branches: Are pruned
 - a. The purpose for pruning: To bear more fruit
 - b. How branches are pruned
 - 1) By the Word
 - 2) By abiding, remaining in Christ

4. Unattached branches

- a. Are by themselves:Not attached or abiding
- b. Cannot bear fruit
- c. Do not understand the nature of bearing fruit: Can do nothing apart from Christ
 - 1) Must abide in Christ to bear fruit
 - 2) Can do nothing apart form Christ
- d. Are doomed: Gathered, thrown away, burned

- 1 "I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener.
- 2 He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful.
- 3 You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you.
- 4 Remain in me, and I will remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me.
- 5 "I am the vine; you are the branches. If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing.
- 6 If anyone does not remain in me, he is like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned.

5. Attached branches: The results and promises

- a. Receive nourishment answered prayers
- b. Glorify God
- c. Prove their attachment discipleship
- 7 If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be given you.
- 8 This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples.
