 - 1) Because He created them
 - 2) Because He chose them to be His servants
 - 3) Because He helps them: Delivers from fear v. 2, 8
- 2. God helps by pouring His blessings on the land and His Spirit on true believers.
 - 1) The redeemed and their descendants will prosper
 - 2) The unbeliever who is redeemed will unashamedly identify with the LORD and His people
- 3. God helps by declaring His pre-eminence – who He is
 - 1) He is their King and Redeemer
 - 2) He is the LORD Almighty
 - 3) He is the First and the Last
 - 4) He alone is God

- 1 "But now listen, Jacob, my servant, Israel, whom I have chosen.
- 2 This is what the Lord says –
 he who made you,
 who formed you in the womb,
 and who will help you:
 Do not be afraid, Jacob, my servant,
