Remind the Church About the Danger of Words and the Foundation of God 2 Timothy 02: 14–21

1 Reminder 1:

Do not argue over words that do not profit the hearers speculations, theories, and petty matters

2 Reminder 2:

Study — seek to be a true teacher of God's Word

- a. To be approved of God
- b. To be unashamed
- c. To correctly teach the Word

3 Reminder 3: Shun godless chatter and discussions

- a. It leads to ungodliness
- b. It eats away as a cancer
- c. Two examples
 - 1) They spiritualise the resurrection
 - 2) They undermine the faith of some

4 Reminder 4: The foundation of God's house is firm

- a. God's great house has two inscriptions
- b. God's earthly house (church) has a variety of articles
 - 1) There are both noble and base articles
 - 2) There has to be a cleansing in order to become a useful instrument

- 14 Keep reminding them of these things.

 Warn them before God against quarrelling about words; it is of no value, and only ruins those who listen.
- 15 Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a workman who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth.
- 16 Avoid godless chatter, because those who indulge in it will become more and more ungodly.
- 17 Their teaching will spread like gangrene.

 Among them are Hymenaeus and Philetus,
- 18 Who have wandered away from the truth. They say that the resurrection has already taken place, and they destroy the faith of some.
- 19 Nevertheless,
 God's solid foundation stands firm,
 sealed with this inscription:
 "The Lord knows those who are his," and,
 "Everyone who confesses the name of the Lord
 must turn away from wickedness."
- 20 In a large house there are articles not only of gold and silver, but also of wood and clay; some are for noble purposes and some for ignoble.
- 21 If a man cleanses himself from the latter, he will be an instrument for noble purposes, made holy, useful to the Master and prepared to do any good work

Flee Youthful Lusts and Follow After the Lord 2 Timothy 02:22–26

- 1 Flee youthful lusts
- 2 Pursue follow after the Lord
- 3 Avoid foolish arguments
- 4 Do not argue or fight with others
 - a. Be kind
 - b. Be prepared to teach
 - c. Do not be resentful
 - d. Correct others in gentleness
 - 1) That the opponents may be led to repentance
 - 2) That the opponents may escape from the trap of the devil

- 22 Flee the evil desires of youth, and pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace, along with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart.
- 23 Don't have anything to do with foolish and stupid arguments, because you know they produce quarrels.
- 24 And the Lord's servant must not quarrel; instead, he must be kind to everyone, able to teach, not resentful.
- 25 Those who oppose him he must gently instruct, in the hope that God will grant them repentance leading them to a knowledge of the truth,
- 26 And that they will come to their senses and escape from the trap of the devil, who has taken them captive to do his will.
