## The Temple Cleansed: Authority over God's House Mathew 21:12-16

(Mk 11:15-19; Lk 19:45-46; see Jn.2:13-16)

- 1. The temple (church) is to be a place where people are not exploited
- 2. The temple (church) is to be a house of prayer
- 3. The temple (church) is to be a place for ministry
- 4. The temple (church) is to be a place where wonderful things are done
- 5. The temple (church) is to be a place where Christ is praised
  - a. Children praised Him
  - b. Some objected
  - c. Christ commanded the children's praise
