Jesus' love for His followers | 1 | It was just before the Passover Feast. Jesus knew that the time had come for him to leave this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he now showed them the full extent of his love. |
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| | c. Jesus' knowledge of the devil | 2 | The evening meal was being served, and the devil had already prompted Judas Iscariot, son of Simon, to betray Jesus. |
| 3. | The extreme demonstrationof royal servicea. Jesus knewHis mission was to serve | 3 | Jesus knew that the Father had put all things under his power, and that he had come from God and was returning to God; |
| | b. Jesus laid aside His outer clothing | 4 | So he got up from the meal, took off his outer clothing, and wrapped a towel around his waist. |
| | c. Jesus washed the disciples' feet | 5 | After that, he poured water into a basin and began to wash his disciples' feet, drying them with the towel that was wrapped around him. |
| 4. | The prerequisite for royal service: Being washed and cleansed | 6 | He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?" |
| | a. Being washed was misunderstood | 7 | Jesus replied, "You do not realize now what I am doing, but later you will understand." |
| | b. Being washed has a deeper meaning: Spiritual cleansing | 8 | "No," said Peter, "you shall never wash my feet." Jesus answered, "Unless I wash you, you have no part with me." |

| c. Being washed was requested | 9 "Then, Lord," Simon Peter replied,"not just my feet but my hands and my head as well!" |
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| d. Being washed was thorough and permanent | 10 Jesus answered,"A person who has had a bath needs only to wash his feet; his whole body is clean.And you are clean, though not every one of you." |
| e. Being washed was not automatic nor did it come by associating with the cleansed | 11 For he knew who was going to betray him, and that was why he said not every one was clean. |
| 5. The meaning of royal service | 12 When he had finished washing their feet, he put on his clothes and returned to his place."Do you understand what I have done for you?" he asked them. |
| a. To serve Jesus as Teacher and Lord | 13 "You call me 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and rightly so, for that is what I am. |
| b. To serve other believers royally, sacrificially: Leading them to be washed and cleansed | 14 Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. |
| 6. <i>The reasons for royal service</i>a. Because of Jesus' example | 15 I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you. |
| b. Because believers are not as great as the Lord | 16 I tell you the truth, no servant is greater than his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him. |
| c. Because of the result: Joy, satisfaction | 17 Now that you know these things, you will be blessed if you do them. |

| <i>The Lords' Supper was given</i> <i>as a permanent ordinance</i> a. Christ took the bread, gave thanks, broke it, and distributed it: His body | 26While they were eating, Jesus took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take and eat; this is my body." |
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| b. Christ took the cup, gave thanks, and distributed it: His blood | 27 Then he took the cup, gave thanks and offered it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you. |
| c. Christ instituted a new covenant: Forgiveness | 28This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. |
| d. Christ promised to celebrate the supper with His followers in the future | 29I tell you, I will not drink of this fruit of the vine from now on until that day when I drink it anew with you in my Father's kingdom." |
| e. Christ and His disciples sang a hymn and departed | 30When they had sung a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives. |
