## The Laws Governing Social and Moral Obligations Exodus 22:16–31

## 1. The law governing seduction or premarital sex

- a. If the woman's parents consent, the offender must marry her and pay a dowry
- b. If the woman's parents object to marriage, the offender must still pay the dowry
- 2. The law governing sorcerers: To be executed
- 3. The law governing bestiality: To be executed
- 4. The law governing idolatry: To be executed
- 5. The law governing strangers
  - a. Must not oppress
  - b. Reason: God's people were strangers in Egypt (the world)
- 6. The law governing the weak and helpless, such as widows and orphans
  - a. Must not take advantage of
  - b. The reason:
    God will hear their cry
    and judge the oppressor
- 7. The law governing loans to the needy
  - a. The law
  - 1) Must not charge interest to the needy

- 16 "If a man seduces a virgin who is not pledged to be married and sleeps with her, he must pay the bride-price, and she shall be his wife.
- 17 If her father absolutely refuses to give her to him, he must still pay the bride-price for virgins.
- 18 Do not allow a sorceress to live.
- 19 Anyone who has sexual relations with an animal is to be put to death.
- 20 Whoever sacrifices to any god other than the LORD must be destroyed.
- 21 Do not mistreat or oppress a foreigner, for you were foreigners in Egypt.
- 22 Do not take advantage of the widow or the fatherless.
- 23 If you do and they cry out to me, I will certainly hear their cry.
- 24 My anger will be aroused, and I will kill you with the sword; your wives will become widows and your children fatherless.
- 25 If you lend money to one of my people among you who is needy, do not treat it like a business deal; charge no interest.

- 2) Must not take any pledge of security, not even a simple cloak (coat)
- b. The reason:
  God hears his cry
  and is compassionate
- 8. The law governing cursing God and rulers: Forbidden
- 9. The law governing offerings to God: Must not hold back
  - a. To give the first fruit of the harvest
  - b. To give the first-born son
  - c. To give the first-born livestock: To give on the eighth day
- 10. The law governing livestock killed by wild animals
  - a. Must protect health (holiness)
  - b. Must not cat unclean, unsafe meat

- 26 If you take your neighbour's cloak as a pledge, return it by sunset,
- 27 because that cloak is the only covering your neighbour bas.What else can they sleep in?When they cry out to me, I will hear, for I am compassionate.
- 28 Do not blaspheme God or curse the ruler of your people.
- 29 Do not hold back offeringsfrom your granaries or your vats.You must give me the first-born of you sons.
- 30 Do the same with your cattle and your sheep. Let them stay with their mothers for seven days, but give them to me on the eighth day.
- 31 You are to be my holy people.

  So do not eat the meat of an animal torn by wild beasts; throw it to the dogs.
