Abram led his whole household to obey God, to enter into the covenant relationship: Every male was circumcised	<ul><li>23 On that very day</li><li>Abraham took his son Ishmael and all those</li><li>born in his household</li><li>or bought with his money,</li><li>every male in his household,</li><li>and circumcised them, as God told him.</li></ul>
b. Abram took the lead in the covenant relationship: He was circumcised	24 Abraham was ninety-nine years old when he was circumcised,

c. Abram led his own child to obey God at the early age of thirteen
d. The account re-emphasized: To stress the importance of the covenant relationship
25 and his son Ishmael his son was thirteen;
26 Abraham and his son Ishmael were both circumcised on that very day.
27 And every male in Abraham's household, including those born in his household or bought from a foreigner, was circumcised with him.
