- 1 Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see.
- 2 This is what the ancients were commended for.
- 3 By faith we understand that the universe was formed at God's command, so that what is seen was not made out of what was visible.
- 4 By faith Abel brought God a better offering than Cain did. By faith he was commended as righteous, when God spoke well of his offerings. And by faith Abel still speaks, even though he is dead.
- 5 By faith Enoch was taken from this life, so that he did not experience death: "He could not be found, because God had taken him away." For before he was taken, he was commended as one who pleased God.
- 6 And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him.
