

Set Free Through God's Salvation and Greatness

Isaiah 40:01–11

1. *God's salvation proclaimed*

a. Voice 1: Comfort God's people

1) Their captivity — warfare, hardship — is over:
A prediction of deliverance from the Babylonian captivity

2) Their sins are paid for, pardoned: Because they had obviously repented

b. Voice 2: Prepare the way for the Lord — repent

1) The preparation

- Build a straight highway for the LORD's army
- Remove all obstacles

2) The result

- God's glory will be revealed
- All mankind will see God's glory

c. Voice 3: Recognize the contrast between people and God

1) People and their glory fade away — just as grass withers and flowers fall:
Because God has power over all

2) God and His Word stand forever:
He will fulfil His promises

1 Comfort, comfort my people, says your God.

2 Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and proclaim to her that her hard service has been completed, that her sin has been paid for, that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins.

3 A voice of one calling:
"In the wilderness prepare the way for the LORD; make straight in the desert a highway for our God.

4 Every valley shall be raised up, every mountain and hill made low; the rough ground shall become level, the rugged places a plain.

5 And the glory of the LORD will be revealed, and all people will see it together. For the mouth of the LORD has spoken."

6 A voice says, "Cry out." And I said, "What shall I cry?" "All people are like grass, and all their faithfulness is like the flowers of the field.

7 The grass withers and the flowers fall, because the breath of the LORD blows on them. Surely the people are grass.

8 The grass withers and the flowers fall, but the word of our God endures forever."

d. Voice 4: Proclaim
the “Good News”
of God’s deliverance

1) Fearlessly proclaim
God’s coming
to rescue His people

2) Fearlessly proclaim
God’s coming in power

- to rule
- to reward people

3) Fearlessly proclaim
God’s tender care
for His people

- He feeds them
- He leads them

9 You who bring good news to Zion,
go up on a high mountain.
You who bring good news to Jerusalem,
lift up your voice with a shout,
lift it up, do not be afraid;
say to the towns of Judah,
“Here is your God!”

10 See, the Sovereign LORD comes with power,
and he rules with a mighty arm.
See, his reward is with him,
and his recompense accompanies him.

11 He tends his flock like a shepherd:
He gathers the lambs in his arms
and carries them close to his heart;
he gently leads those that have young.
