

# The Great Encouragement and Message Given to Moses: Deliverance and Freedom Exodus 06:01–09

## 1. *God's great encouragement to His messenger*

- a. God promised to raise  
His mighty hand  
against the king:  
To free His people
- b. God revealed His new name:  
The LORD (Jehovah, Yahweh),  
the God of redemption  
and deliverance
- c. God reviewed His covenant:  
His great promise  
to give the promised land  
to His people
- d. God shared His concern  
for the sufferings of His people:  
He heard their cries  
and remembered His covenant

## 2. *God's great encouragement to His people*

- a. God is the LORD  
(Jehovah, Yahweh)
- b. God will deliver His people:  
From slavery and suffering
- c. God will redeem His people:  
With great power,  
with mighty acts of judgment

- 1 Then the LORD said to Moses,  
“Now you will see  
what I will do to Pharaoh:  
Because of my mighty hand  
he will let them go;  
because of my mighty hand  
he will drive them out of his country.”
- 2 God also said to Moses,  
“I am the LORD.
- 3 I appeared to Abraham,  
to Isaac and to Jacob as God Almighty,  
but by my name the LORD  
I did not make myself fully known to them.
- 4 I also established my covenant with them  
to give them the land of Canaan,  
where they resided as foreigners.
- 5 Moreover,  
I have heard the groaning of the Israelites,  
whom the Egyptians are enslaving,  
and I have remembered my covenant.
- 6 “Therefore,  
say to the Israelites:  
‘I am the LORD,  
and I will bring you out  
from under the yoke of the Egyptians.  
I will free you from being slaves to them,  
and I will redeem you  
with an outstretched arm  
and with mighty acts of judgment.

d. God will adopt His people

1) God's promise:

I will be your God  
and you will be my people

2) God's purpose:

That they might know  
that He is the Lord,  
their great Deliverer

e. God will lead His people  
to the promised land

f. God is the LORD  
(able to do all He says)

g. God's messenger proclaimed  
God's message,  
but the people refused to listen

7 I will take you as my own people,  
and I will be your God.  
Then you will know  
that I am the LORD your God,  
who brought you out  
from under the yoke of the Egyptians.

8 And I will bring you to the land  
I swore with uplifted hand  
to give to Abraham,  
to Isaac and to Jacob.  
I will give it to you as a possession.  
I am the LORD.' ”

9 Moses reported this to the Israelites,  
but they did not listen to him  
because of their discouragement  
and harsh labour.
