Abraham's Prayer Answered; Lot Was Saved and Sodom Destroyed: Genesis 19:23–29

1. Lot's warning of judgment — a lesson for all

- a. The compromising believer: Lost everything
- b. The depraved unbelievers were judged, suffered fire and brimstone
- c. The spouse of a backsliding believer:Loved the world and was judged

Lot's deliverance in answer to prayer

- a. The prayer warrior's urgent anticipation:Abraham arose early and looked to see what had happened
- b. God's remembrance:Saved Lot —all because of Abraham's persevering prayer

- 23 By the time Lot reached Zoar, the sun had risen over the land.
- 24 Then the LORD rained down burning sulphur on Sodom and Gomorrah from the LORD out of the heavens.
- 25 Thus he overthrew those cities and the entire plain, destroying all those living in the cities and also the vegetation in the land.
- 26 But Lot's wife looked back, and she became a pillar of salt.
- 27 Early the next morning Abraham got up and returned to the place where he had stood before the LORD.
- 28 He looked down toward Sodom and Gomorrah, toward all the land of the plain, and he saw dense smoke rising from the land, like smoke from a furnace.
- 29 So when God destroyed the cities of the plain, he remembered Abraham, and he brought Lot out of the catastrophe that overthrew the cities where Lot had lived.
