Abram Gave Birth to Ishmael and the Arabs: Impatient Faith — the Terrible Wrong of Impatience Genesis 16:01–16

- 1. Sara was childless and became impatient:
 The causes of impatience
 - a. An unfulfilled desire: Sara craved a child
 - b. A mistaken thought:That God had kept Sara barren— that God's promisedid not include her
 - c. A worldly, carnal suggestion: That Abram marry Sara's maid, Hagar, and bear children
- 2. Sara gave her maid to Abram: The terrible consequences of impatience
 - a. A wrong plan and method
 - b. The collapse of faith and patience
 - c. Sinful behaviour:By Abram, Sara and Hagar
 - 1) Immorality, adultery and polygamy
 - 2) Spite, malice, insolence, scorn, reproach, a haughty spirit
 - 3) Jealousy and blaming others
 - 4) Disturbed and severed relationships

- Now Sarai, Abram's wife,had borne him no children.But she had an Egyptian slave named Hagar;
- 2 so she said to Abram, "The LORD has kept me from having children. Go, sleep with my slave; perhaps I can build a family through her." Abram agreed to what Sarai said.
- 3 So after Abram had been living in Canaan ten years, Sarai his wife took her Egyptian slave Hagar and gave her to her husband to be his wife.
- 4 He slept with Hagar, and she conceived. When she knew she was pregnant, she began to despise her mistress.
- 5 Then Sarai said to Abram,
 "You are responsible for the wrong
 I am suffering.
 I put my slave in your arms,
 and now that she knows she is pregnant,
 she despises me.
 May the LORD judge between you and me."
- 6 "Your slave is in your hands," Abram said. "Do with her whatever you think best." Then Sarai mistreated Hagar; so she fled from her.

- 3. The LORD saved the maid, Hagar: The solution or answer
 - a. A confrontation with God
 - b. Receiving the promises of God
 - 1) A special heritage: An innumerable seed
 - A special assurance:God will always hear and meet the need of the distressed
 - 3) A son with a special nature: Independent, head-strong, self-willed, violently aggressive and at odds with others
 - c. Worshipping and praising God: El Roi, "the God who sees me"

- d. Obeying God
- 1) Hagar obeyed and returned
- Abram obeyed:
 Named the son Ishmael,
 as God had instructed

- 7 The angel of the LORD found Hagar near a spring in the desert; it was the spring that is beside the road to Shur.
- 8 And he said, "Hagar, slave of Sarai, where have you come from, and where are you going?"

 "I'm running away from my mistress Sarai," she answered.
- 9 Then the angel of the LORD told her, "Go back to your mistress and submit to her."
- 10 The angel added,
 "I will increase your descendants so much that they will be too numerous to count."
- 11 The angel of the LORD also said to her:
 "You are now pregnant
 and you will give birth to a son.
 You shall name him Ishmael,
 for the LORD has heard of your misery.
- 12 He will be a wild donkey of a man; his hand will be against everyone and everyone's hand against him, and he will live in hostility toward all his brothers."
- 13 She gave this name to the LORD who spoke to her:

 "You are the God who sees me," for she said,

 "I have now seen the One who sees me."
- 14 That is why the well was called Beer Lahai Roi; it is still there, between Kadesh and Bered.
- 15 So Hagar bore Abram a son, and Abram gave the name Ishmael to the son she had borne.
- 16 Abram was eighty-six years old when Hagar bore him Ishmael.
